



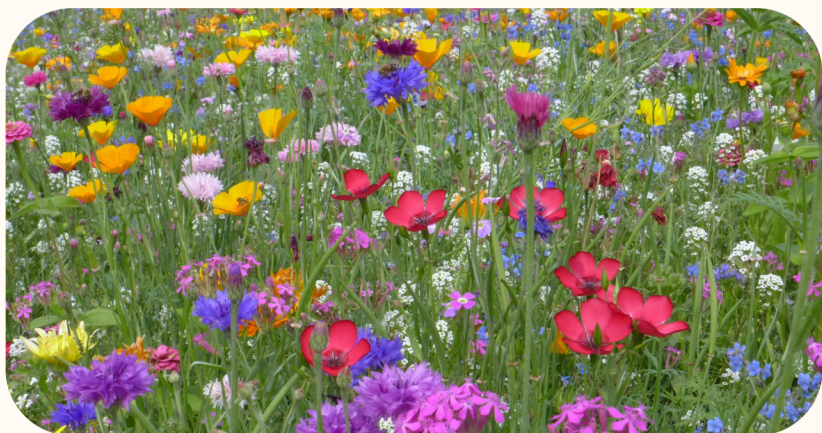
SUKKAT SHALOM RENEWAL SPACE

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

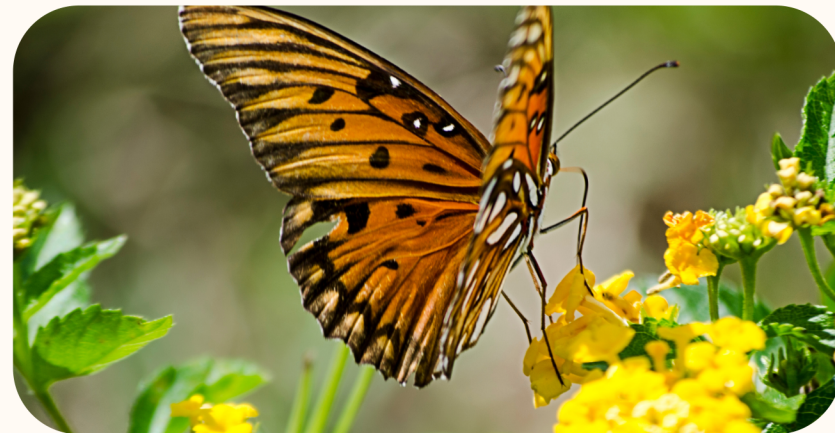
Embrace Plant Communities
Native plants in a meadow style ecosystem



Avoid Environmental Toxins
No herbicides, pesticides nor toxins



Support Pollinators
Birds, butterflies, bees and others



Keep it Low-Maintenance
Self-sustaining, drought tolerant and self-seeding



2024 PLANS

Finish digging and burying trench needed to divert runoff water.
Smother weeds by covering them with compostable cardboard and topping this with compost and mulch.
Seed bare areas with a cover crop of buckwheat to suppress further weeds and act as a ground cover to retain moisture in the soil.

2025 PLANS

Winter: Work with a native horticulturalist to design renewal space and finalize a list of the drought resistant plants and wildflowers that will be installed.
Early Spring: Clear area of debris and lightly till in preparation for planting.
Late Spring: Mark out the areas as per landscape design. Order furniture, bird houses and other items for installation. Plant flowers and grasses. Sow seeds.
Summer: Irrigate the area regularly for a year until plants are established.
